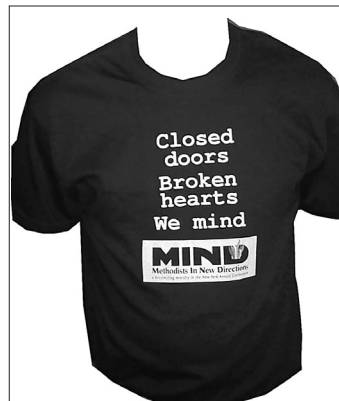

# Who we are

**MIND** is a grassroots organization of United Methodists working to end our denomination's doctrinal prejudice and institutional discrimination against lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people and committed to living more fully into God's radical Welcome right now and right here. We are a regional group, organizing on the conference level within the New York Annual Conference (NYAC). We are part of a larger reconciling movement and are affiliated with the national Reconciling Ministries Network (RMN).\* MIND was founded in 2006, but is part of

a long tradition of reconciling activism within NYAC and stands on the shoulders of many who came before us.

We work year-round with local congregations to help them develop and expand LGBT-inclusive ministries. We sponsor events and speakers, as well as organizing training for our members and supporters. We also work within the institutional structures of the UMC in a variety of ways, including a



yearly witness and creative presence at the four-day annual conference session of NYAC.

We believe in living the loving, radical, inclusive Gospel. We believe that Christians are called to follow the example of Christ in proclaiming the all-encompassing, extravagant love of

God and that the church has a special obligation to welcome the poor, the marginalized and the oppressed. We

believe that the church has no business mimicking the prevailing prejudices of the society around it.

We believe that the transformation of the church will—must—come from the bottom up and that living our faith means each of us taking the next steps in the reconciling ministry in our own congregations—whatever those steps are, however big or small.

*\*The term 'reconciling' for this mission was suggested in 1982 because of the need for reconciliation between the United Methodist Church and its LGBT members.*

## We MIND...

...*that the* UMC Book of Discipline says the church “does not condone the practice of homosexuality and considers this practice incompatible with Christian teaching” (§1161G).

...*that the* Discipline states “self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church” (§1304.3).

...*that the* Discipline further says “Ceremonies that celebrate homosexual unions shall not be conducted by our ministers and shall not be conducted in our churches” (§1341.6).

...*that in* 2005 the Judicial Council, the church's highest judicial body, ruled that ministers could bar gay and lesbian people from membership based solely on their sexual orientation.

...*that each* year countless LGBT people are exiled to a spiritual wilderness as they turn away from the church because of its bigotry; each year promising young seminarians choose to be ordained in another denomination because they cannot abide the UMC's discrimination; and each year the United Methodist Church loses thousands of members as it fails to embody the loving, radical, inclusive Gospel that could inspire people to join.
